WES GENERAL DISCIPLINE PROCEDURES



Wednesday School



Wednesday School is from (3:10 – 4:30) Disciplinary Detention assigned by an administrator. Your classroom teachers may assign a Wednesday School for not turning in your homework, not having your discipline sheet signed, etc.

Failure to serve an assigned Wednesday School will result in ONE ISS day.

Wednesday School



The following slides list offenses that could result in a Wednesday School.

Note: These are General Discipline Procedures. Depending on the individual circumstance, the disciplinary consequence could change.

Wednesday School



- **3 Unexcused Tardies**
- **Disciplinary Consequence for Failure to Follow School Rules**
- **Dress Code – 3rd referral**

Wednesday School



- **Medicines Not in Compliance with Clinic Procedures**
- **Not following traffic flow drop off / pick up procedures (this does include parents that drop off/pick up from Staff parking lot)**

Cell Phones



A referral for a cell phone will mean that your cell phone will be picked up and returned to a parent on the 1st offense and a Wednesday School will be issued. Each subsequent offense there will be a \$15 fine and the phone will be confiscated and returned to the parent after the fine has been paid plus be assigned a Wednesday School.

Cell Phones



Remember:

- **The school shall not attempt to recover the item for you because they are not permitted on campus. Do not bring your expensive phones to school and if they are lost or stolen, you can report to Mrs. Williams or Mrs. Moore, but we cannot take the time to investigate this.**
- **Please do not leave them unattended at any time during the school day.**

ISS



In School Suspension

- **Students will complete their work assigned by their teacher or teachers**
- **The number of ISS days assigned will depend on the offense**

ISS



The following slides list offenses that could result in ISS Days.

Note: These are General Discipline Procedures. Depending on the individual circumstance, the disciplinary consequence could change.

ISS



- **Disrespect to Staff/Faculty**
- **Dress Code Violation – Student must be in compliance with the district and school policy when entering the building. A student may be referred to ISS at any time during the school day**
- **Inappropriate Language**

ISS



- **Computer AUP Violation (Acceptable Use Policy)**
(could result in being blocked from using any school computer and removed from a computer-based class)
- **Academic Dishonesty/Cheating**

ISS



- **Fighting (Following Suspension Days)**
- **7 Second Rule Violation (Not Leaving the Area of a Fight or Adding to the Disruption)**
- **Disruption of School Operation/Reckless Speech**
- **Possession of Knife on Campus**

ISS



- **Medicines Not in Compliance with Clinic Procedures**
- **Skipping (any class or entire school day)**
- **Leaving Campus without Permission**

ISS



- **Loitering (unsupervised in building after 3:30)**
- **Sexual Harassment/Bullying**
- **Gang Activity**
- **Harassment/Bullying**

SUSPENSION



Suspension is a school-directed absence.

The number of days of suspension depends on the offense.

SUSPENSION



- **Disrespect to Staff/Faculty**
- **Fighting**
- **Disruption of School Operation/Reckless Speech**
- **Possession of Knife on Campus**
- **Inappropriate Language**

SUSPENSION



- **Failure to Follow ISS Procedures**
- **Computer AUP Violation (Could result in DAEP, District Alternative Education Program)**
- **Dress Code (continued referrals)**
- **Sexual Harassment/Bullying**
- **Gang Activity**

DAEP



**DAEP – District Alternative
Education Placement**

DAEP or EXPULSION



The following slides list offenses that could result in DAEP Days.

Note: These are General Discipline Procedures. Depending on the individual circumstance, the disciplinary consequence could change.

DAEP or EXPULSION



- **Fighting**
- **Possession of Knife on Campus**
- **Persistent Misconduct**
- **Sexual Harassment/Bullying**
- **Drug or Alcohol Possession or Being under the Influence**
- **Gang Activity**

DAEP or EXPULSION



- **Assault resulting in Serious Bodily Injury**
- **Serious Disruption of School Operation**
- **Felony Charges for Offenses on or off Campus**
- **Computer AUP Violation**

FIGHTING



PLEASE REMEMBER HOW
SERIOUS THIS CAN BE

**WE HAVE A 7-SECOND RULE IN WHICH
YOU MUST LEAVE THE AREA, NOT
MOVE TOWARD A FIGHT, OR
CELEBRATE A FIGHT WITHIN 7
SECONDS OR FACE CONSEQUENCES**

FIGHTING (CONT'D)

**VIOLATION OF 7 SECOND RULE= 1-3
DAYS OF ISS and possibly 3 days Suspension**

Sexual harassment

Hostile Environment Sexual Harassment occurs when unwelcome sexual conduct unreasonably interferes with a student's educational performance by creating a intimidating, hostile, abusive, or offensive environment

This can be **VERBAL** or
PHYSICAL

Sexual Harassment

- Parent contact
- Possible WS, ISS or SUSPENSION
- Possible DAEP

Bullying



- **Definition:** This is school board policy and in the district code of conduct.

Bullying occurs when a student or group of students engages in written or verbal expression or physical conduct that:

1. Will have the effect of physically harming a student, damaging a student's property, or placing a student in reasonable fear of harm to the student's person or of damage to the student's property or
2. To be sufficiently severe, persistent, or pervasive to create and intimidating, threatening, or abusive educational environment for a student.

Bullying Continued:



- * The state and district are now very aware of this problem and all teachers and staff members must be made aware of the policy.
- Students should report bullying to a teacher, other staff member or administrator.
- * If verified, the consequences could range from ISS to DAEP.

Disruption of School/Reckless Speech:
Stating or writing about doing harm to the
school or others



Consequences range from ISS
to possible **SUSPENSION** or
DAEP

ACADEMIC DISHONESTY

- Representing another person's work as your own
- Copying from others on class work, homework, or tests and quizzes.
- Plagiarism: Borrowing too closely from the written work of others on a research project or report.

CONSEQUENCES: ISS AND GRADE PENALTIES RANGING FROM RETAKES TO "0"



The bus is considered an extension of our building. All rules and consequences apply (Wednesday School, ISS, Suspension, Bus Removal, or DAEP)

Skipping/Loitering

Skipping/Loitering

Skipping: (any class or entire day) can result in ISS for 1 or more days



Loitering after school: Parent contact, written warning, and/or, ISS. Rides must pick you up in time. You must exit the building by 3:15 and be off campus by 3:30 unless you are in a practice, meeting, or tutorial.

A word about the Clinic and medications:

- **MEDICATIONS MUST BE KEPT IN THE CLINIC** (unless you have a note from doctor AND it is on file with the clinic)
- **MUST HAVE PASS FROM TEACHER TO GO TO CLINIC AND CALL PARENT**

**VIOLATION= ISS OR SUSPENSION
OR DAEP**



A REMINDER ABOUT ISS:

- Being placed in ISS for ANY offense makes you ineligible for the day you are in ISS PLUS the next day. THIS CAN MEAN SERIOUS IMPLICATIONS FOR THOSE WHO ARE INVOLVED IN EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES
