What is PBIS? PBIS stands for Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports. WHB uses PBIS so that we can improve behavior in our school. Each student at WHB wears a name tag in the common areas of the building such as the cafeteria, gym, and halls. Staff members punch their cards if they see them following the CUBS guidelines. (**C**are for Everyone and Everything, **U**se Good Manners, **B**e Ready, **S**how Respect) Students who have all 10 paws punched get to spin the wheel on **Mondays** for a prize. Most prizes are things such as Help with the Pledges, Office Helper, Sit in the Teacher's Desk, etc. This has been a very positive reward system for our students!

TISD Elementary School Tardy Procedures:

Parents are responsible for their child/children arriving to school on time. Tardiness creates a distraction in the classroom and results in a loss of instructional time for the student. The following steps will be taken in the event students arrive tardy to school for unexcused reasons.

1-3 Tardy	Verbal Warning by Office Staff @ 7:50am or later
4	Teacher contacts parent / guardian and documents contact
5	Letter to parent / guardian from Campus Principal
6	Parent contact by Campus Administrator
7 and up	Lunch Detention per tardy

A Note from the Counselor: Secrets

This month students will be learning about good and bad secrets. A good secret is a fun or happy surprise that people enjoy receiving. An example is a present or a compliment. A bad secret is something mean or hurtful that people would not enjoy receiving. An example is hitting or calling someone a rude name. It is important for students and everyone to understand the difference. Together at home, try to notice when something is a good or bad secret. Then discuss this as a family and talk about how each person of the family deals with good or bad secrets. Students are encouraged to tell someone at home and school if there is a serious situation, which might be kept as a bad secret. Please reinforce this at home as well. Have fun with this activity and get to know each other more!
